Letter from the President

Dear Friends of CHINAR Kashmir,

On behalf of the entire CHINAR Kashmir team, it gives me great pleasure to share with you the progress CHINAR Kashmir has made during the past year.

One of our major areas of focus has been to complete the construction of a CHINAR Home Complex at Khanpora Budgam. Once complete, this would be a major milestone for us as the children would have a permanent home that would provide enough space for a good library, spacious computer lab and a big playground. It will also allow us to start our skills training programs for women and underprivileged youth. The construction work is going well and we have completed the framing structure and we are roofing the building presently.

While a lot of our time has been taken by this construction project, it has not shifted our focus from our two flagship programs—The CHINAR Home Program (CHP) and the Remote Child Sponsorship Program (RCSP). Both of these programs continue to flourish and help a significant number of children.

India's reputed online donation platforms Give India continues to support us for our programmes. The Give India platform gives donors in U.S., U.K. and other countries as well as other state of India the option to donate to our programs online and gives CHINAR Kashmir the visibility that our programs deserve.

The Jammu and Kashmir Bank Ltd.has also extended its support and part of Remote Child Sponsored Programme is sponsored under its CSR programme.

As you all are aware that Kashmir region has been hit by an unprecedented flood which has been described as the worst in over a century. With thousands of villages and major towns and cities flooded, close to a million people have been displaced and hundreds have perished. Most areas of the capital city Srinagar were submerged causing extensive damage. This flood has caused a breakdown in communication, widespread damage to infrastructure and machinery of governance. Given the magnitude of this disaster CHINAR Kashmir is partnering with several organizations and groups to provide coordinated assistance to the victims of this flood.

This could not have been possible without the tremendous support that you continue to provide us. We especially need your generous support this year so that we can complete the construction process as quickly as possible and also continue to support flood hit people of Kashmir. On behalf of the CHINAR Kashmir Board, I offer thanks to you all for your support and confidence in us.

Introduction:

Child Nurture and Relief Kashmir (CHINAR Kashmir) is a non-political and non-profit organization working for the psychosocial rehabilitation of orphans and vulnerable children in Jammu and Kashmir. CHINAR Kashmir has been providing a nurturing environment for socially and economically disadvantaged children since 2004. We do not discriminate on the basis of religion, culture or gender.

We are running two distinctive programs in Jammu and Kashmir

- CHINAR Home Program (CHP): This is a home for a group of orphaned boys and girls who are being cared for in a familial environment by live-in caregivers (Mothers). The children are provided quality education in good private schools and in-house tuition. A myriad set of extra-curricular activities including photography, music, computer training, art and games etc are also organized so as to ensure a well-rounded education.

- CHINAR Remote Child Sponsorship Program (RCSP): Through this program we provide assistance to socially or economically disadvantaged children without moving them away from their homes. Our monthly support includes food, school fees, stationery, and clothes besides other basic needs and has beneficiaries from various parts of J&K.

We also did extensive relief and rehabilitation work during the 2005 earthquake that hit the Uri area of J&K. We provided semi-permanent shelters and sanitation units to residents of two villages in Uri and skills-training to a group of women from the area. We also did some relief work focused on the children impacted by an avalanche in Waltengo in 2005.

For the flood hit victims, we have provided immediate relief, our primary focus is on providing medium-term and long-term assistance. With the harshness of a Himalayan winter approaching, we want to ensure that the survivors are equipped with the right materials to cope with these winter conditions. As such our assistance will include

Medium-term Assistance: Flooring, woollens, blankets, water filters, school supplies

hygiene kits, sanitary napkins and disinfectants

Long-term Assistance: Shelters, reconstruction and livelihood revival



Our flood relief and rehabilitation work so far...

<p>Shelters:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * We have assisted 156 families in rebuilding their homes which had been lost to the floods * We have also assisted 104 families in restoration of their partially damaged homes so that they are safe to live in * We are in the process of assisting with the reconstruction/restoration of another 150 homes.
<p>Livelihood:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * We have provided livelihood assistance to 8 families whose livelihoods had been impacted by the floods by providing them with cows * We have also given cash assistance to 4 farmers who had gotten injured during the floods
<p>Education:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * We distributed stationery, school bags and woollens to 161 children from 3 flood affected schools * We also distributed 70 Eid Gift Bags among children prior to the Eid festival
<p>Relief:</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * We have distributed rice, blankets, woollens, medicines, water purification tablets, pulses biscuits etc among hundreds of flood affected families.

CHINAR Home:

The Home continues to provide an enriching environment for the children. The children are well settled and continue their schooling at two private schools in Srinagar—one in Baghat and the other in Balgarden. They also continue to be tutored by a group of four tutors who visit every day.



Residential Complex:

The construction of new CHINAR Home has been almost completed. Presently roofing of the Home is in process.

RCSP - Helping Children Across the State

We continue to increase the number of beneficiaries in our Remote Child Sponsorship Program. The children covered under this programme were invited to CHINAR Office for the interaction with Board of Directors. They enjoyed the day with our kids at CHINAR Home.

Partnership with Give India:

After a rigorous process of assessment and verification which lasted several months, CHINAR Kashmir was included in the listing of NGO's on the reputed international donation platform **Give India** in May 2012. This means that donors in US and UK can donate to us through the Give India website and get a tax benefit in their respective countries. Our inclusion on the Give India platform bears testimony to the quality and strength of our programs and the real impact they are having on the ground.

Give India is India's premier online donation platform that connects individuals with over 150 reputed grassroots NGO's like CHINAR Kashmir and offers international donors the option to donate to these NGO's and get a tax benefit in their respective countries.

Children's Activities:

The Global Education & Leadership Foundation had organized an art competition called "MAGIC WITH COLORS" at New Delhi. One of the kid namely Imtiyaz Ahmad Mir participated in it and got Certificate of Commendation.

Future Plans:

- ⊗ Finishing the construction of the residential complex to provide permanent space for CHINAR Home and expansion of our current CHINAR Home and RCSP programs
- ⊗ Skills training programs for women and marginalized youth. Community Awareness Program to educate rural communities about various development schemes.
