## Letter from the President

*Dear Friends of CHINAR Kashmir,*

*On behalf of the entire CHINAR Kashmir team, it gives me great pleasure to be interacting with you again, for sharing the progress CHINAR Kashmir has made during the year gone-by (2013-14). Unfortunately the past year (in Kashmir), was dominated by the Sep 2014 Floods which caused huge devastation in its wake. The Sep 2014 Floods will always stand as a Milestone in history with people now-onwards, talking of: Before and After the Great Floods. In Srinagar alone Jhelum breached at twenty-three places and the flooding depth varied from a few feet to as high as twenty feet in certain areas, with some areas remaining submerged for more the twenty days. The Trauma caused by these Floods will take a long time to heal, but people will always remember the Herculean efforts put in by common Kashmiris to help each other, in that dark hour of despondency, surpassing all the known benchmarks of generosity, bravery and humanity. These Floods also gave birth to heroes like Aadil Chopan of Pohlu, Brein-Nishat, who was unfortunately drowned while trying to distribute drinking water bottles to marooned people, on his own.*

*Your own CHINAR Kashmir did its bit. Reacting immediately (with help from GOONJ), we distributed relief materials like hundreds of Blankets and tens of MTs of Rice to the effected people. After the waters receded we adopted three areas in the three effected Districts and started rehabilitation works. With efforts from your Directors, an amount of more than Rs. 1.40 Crores was collected from Donors all over the world and a wide range of works like; Re-construction / Repairs of damaged buildings, helping Schools, reviving livelihoods, distributing Hygiene Kits, Water Filters, heavy Quilts (In Winter) etc. and constructing new Toilet Blocks etc., were complete by March '15.*

*This huge re-habilitation work did take most of our attention; but our Flagship Programmes viz. the CHINAR Home Program (CHP) and the Remote Child Sponsorship Program (RCSP) also remained in focus and are going-on well. The construction of a CHINAR Home Complex at Khanpora Budgam (our most ambitious Project) also continued apace, albeit a little behind schedule due to the Flood commitments. But we are sure to commission it in the first half of next year. It will then allow us to start our skills training programs for women and underprivileged youth.*

*India's reputed on-line donation platforms Give-India continues to support us. And the Jammu and Kashmir Bank Ltd. continued its support for our Remote Child Sponsored Programme.*

*All this could not have been possible without the tremendous support that you continue to provide us. Please continue your generous support this year too, so that we can complete the construction process and also continue to support flood hit people of Kashmir. On behalf of the CHINAR Kashmir Board, I Offer thanks to you all for your support and confidence in us.*

## Introduction:

**Child Nurture and Relief Kashmir (CHINAR Kashmir) is a non-political and non-profit organization working for the psychosocial rehabilitation of orphans and vulnerable children in Jammu and Kashmir. CHINAR Kashmir has been providing a nurturing environment for socially and economically disadvantaged children since 2004. We do not discriminate on the basis of religion, culture or gender. We are running two distinctive programs in Jammu and Kashmir.**

### CHINAR Home Program (CHP):

**This is a home for a group of orphaned and / or; destitute / disadvantaged / very poor; Boys and girls who are being cared for, in a familial environment by live-in caregivers (Mothers). The children are provided quality education in good private schools and in-house tuition. A myriad set of extra-curricular activities including photography, music, computer training, art and games etc are also organized so as to ensure a well-rounded education.**



### CHINAR Remote Child Sponsorship Program (RCSP):



**Through this program we provide assistance to socially or economically disadvantaged children without moving them away from their homes. Our monthly assistance / support includes: School-fees, Bus-fees (wherever needed), Tuition charges (whenever found necessary), School uniforms, Stationery and sets of summer & winter clothes and Dietary supplements too, besides some other basic needs, which come-up. We continue to scale up our Remote Child Sponsorship Program. The children covered under this program are invited to CHINAR Kashmir office for interaction with Directors at regular intervals to get an overall update about their progress in studies. Our objective is to ensure that the basic needs of the child are met and more importantly, that their education does not suffer. We currently have Seventy Two children in this program from various regions of J&K, including far-off Ladakh.**

## Our Disaster-Relief Work:

### Earlier

Besides our work with children, we also have done extensive relief and rehabilitation work whenever such occasions arose. During the October 2005 earthquake that hit the Uri area of J&K, we provided semi-permanent shelters and sanitation units to residents of two villages' in Uri and skills-training to a group of women from the area. We also did some relief work focused on the children and their School impacted by a devastating avalanche in Waltengo (South Kashmir) in 2005.

### Post September-2014 Floods

During the devastating floods of September 2014 our organization was actively engaged in relief and rehabilitation work:

Within two to three days of the Floods occurring, we were able to provide immediate relief, by way of; hundreds of Blankets, Tons of Rice, large quantities of Daals and some medicines etc. too, to hundreds of affected people within Srinagar city (in collaboration with the Delhi-based NGO – GOONJ).

Then, we did extensive work in rebuilding homes in different regions of the three worst effected Districts of Kashmir viz. Beighpora in District Pulwama, Nayi Basti in District Anantnag and Suthra Shahi in District Srinagar. In addition to assisting in the reconstruction of hundreds of homes and helping Schools, we also provided Hygiene-kits, Water-filters and some Medicines / Baby-food in these areas, besides constructing some Sanitation Blocks at different locations in the flood-ravaged area of Narkara in District Srinagar. We also assisted in livelihood-revival for several families, especially, by way of providing Cows to those families who had lost their Cows and not the Cow-sheds in those devastating Floods. All this was done within the limits set by the quantum of Funds available for this effort. In this connection we shall be ever-grateful to all the numerous Donors, of all hues, from within the country and around the world, who very generously donated for making this effort of ours a success. The effort of children of a school in Bangalore in collecting money for food-victims in Kashmir and inviting our organization to collect the same in a Function will always be remembered! And of course, special mention here is needed, of our unbounded gratitude, to the large number of Kashmiris living abroad in the UAE, UK, USA and Australia who; individually and in some cases through their Charity organizations helped us generously and provided the bulk of our Funds, in this time of need.
