INTRODUCTION

Child Nurture and Relief Kashmir (CHINAR Kashmir) is a non-profit, non-religious, apolitical organization helping orphans and destitute children, women and youth in Jammu & Kashmir.

CHINAR Kashmir, has been active in Jammu and Kashmir since 2004 when we started with our pilot project – a

Home, for a group of orphaned boys and girls in Srinagar. We have since grown to include several other programs but our core values of, providing quality assistance with accountability and transparency at its heart, have remained the same. Our focus has always been on improving the lives of marginalized children, women and families, primarily through education and development of employment-oriented skills. We are based in Jammu and Kashmir and run several innovative programs geared towards social and economic empowerment of women and youth; ensuring familial care and education for destitute children; and providing material assistance to needy families.

We have also done extensive disaster relief and rehabilitation work in Kashmir since 2004. Our work has been supported by generous monetary donations from both individuals and institutions as well as through the boundless energy and hard work of our team of dedicated volunteers.

OUR MISSION

Our mission is to provide means and resources to children in need to enable them to have basic necessities of life. We believe in the inherent worth of all the children and their rights to be nurtured, protected and given opportunities to develop their full potential. OUR PROGRAMS

We have been active in Jammu and Kashmir since 2004 when we started with our pilot project – a home for a group of orphaned boys and girls in Srinagar. We have since grown to include several other programs mainly the following:

1. CHINAR HOME PROGRAM(CHP)

This is a Home for a group of destitute children mainly orphans (Boys) who are being cared for in a familial environment by live-in caregivers (Mothers). The children are provided quality education in good private schools besides in-house tuition. A myriad set of extra-curricular activities including photography, computer training, art and games etc. are also organized so as to ensure a well-rounded education.

2. REMOTE CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM (RCSP)

Under this programme, the educational/financial assistance to the needy children up to class 12th is ensured based on regular progress updates and assessment. CHINAR Kashmir (CK) aims to reach out to the most destitute families who have no or meagre source of income to sustain their families. Intervention by CK helps children of such families to continue their studies at least till 12th class. CK under RCSP provides students with monthly monetary help to support basic necessities like food and medicine. 8nbsp; CK also provides Summer/Winter School Uniform, Stationary and Books, School Fee, Bus Fee, Tuition Fee, School Bags, Casual clothing (Twice a year).

3. SCHOLORSHIP, TRAINING AND EDUCATION PROGRAMME FOR UNDERGRADUATES AND POST-GRADUATES (STEP-UP)

STEP-UP is an extension of the Remote Child Sponsorship Program (RCSP). Under this programme, CHINAR Kashmir sponsors those students who are willing to continue their higher education (beyond, Class 12th). As education is a powerful tool to build a career and a better future, CHINAR Kashmir came up with this programme to help students who are keen on continuing their higher studies but but cannot continue due to; abject poverty, poor socio-economic condition caused by the sudden loss of single or both parents, or ill health or loss of the earning member in the family. The students who are helped through this programme are pursuing technical degrees and diploma courses like Electrical Engineering, Bachelor of Medicine Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS), Bachelor's in Technology (B.Tech), Bachelors's in Computer Application (BCA), Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA), B.Sc. Nursing, Female Multi-Purpose Health Worker (FMPHW) etc within and outside J&K.

4. SKILLS ENHANCEMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT (SEED)

Under this programme, training in marketable vocational trades like cutting and tailoring, is provided to girls/women This allows them to sharpen their abilities, empower themselves by honing their skills and earn a livelihood, which transforms their lives and of their families.

5. GIVING HOUSING ASSISTANCE AND RELIEF (GHAR)

GHAR Programme was framed to help those poor and destitute families who don't have a proper roof over their head and for those also; who have a house but don't have basic amenities essential for a dignified living, suitable for the harsh winters of Kashmir. So, through GHAR programme we help such families by either rebuilding or repairing their homes(e.g damaged/leaking roofs, toilets, and separate cooking areas etc) and providing them a safe and dignified living space.

6. DISASTER RELEIF AND REHABLITATION (DRR)

This programme came into existence when JK witnessed devastating earthquake in the year 2005. CK through this programme have extensively helped people at the time of natural man made disasters. Apart from that, CK has also helped needy people with food kits, Sadqa e Fitr, monetary help for medicines, living expenses, etc from time to time.

RECOGNITION / ACHIEVEMENTS:

In January 2020, CHINAR Kashmir was awarded the "State award under the category of Social Reform and Empowerment" by Government of Jammu and Kashmir.

The model of CHINAR Kashmir Home and the basic methodology that CHINAR Kashmir follows for the rehabilitation of children can be replicated anywhere across the country. This fact was established when "CHINAR Home Programme" was selected as one of the best practices and was published in the book "The vision of Antyodaya" a study on Documentation and compilation of Antyodaya Based Best Practices in February 2020. The study was conducted by Indian Social Responsibility Network (ISRN) and supported by Ministry of Culture, Government of India.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR 2020

CHINAR Kashmir was awarded as the Best NGO for Social Reforms and Empowerment by Jammu and Kashmir Government.

CHINAR Home Programme was selected under the category of "Best Practices" for publication in the book called "The vision of Antyodaya" by Indian Social Responsibility Network (ISRN)

A 10 day workshop for SEED Trainers organized by Rangasutra, an NGO and facilitated by J&K Handicraft and Handloom department was hosted at CHINAR Kashmir Home, Khanpora.

37 students supported by CHINAR Kashmir through educational programmes had appeared in JK Board Exams (10th, 11th and 12th).

100 destitute families including those who are helped under RCSP were provided monthly monetary assistance during lockdown for a period of Six months.

One new child from Waltengo Anantnang, who has lost both parents, enrolled in CHINAR Home Program.

The monitoring and evaluation of children helped under RCSP has become a challenge during COVID. Our team has devised new mechanisms to keep in touch with all the students of RCSP so that the programme goes on smoothly.
